

Outside space for break time




Table tennis, picnic benches, spinning chairs – so much to discover!













The subjects you will study include English and drama, mathematics, science, geography, history, modern foreign languages, theology and philosophy, art, music, design technology (food, resistant materials and textiles), ICT, physical education and personal, social, health and economic education. In modern languages you will study French and Spanish in parallel for the first half term. You will decide which language to study from after half term. In Year 8, all students study Classics and at the end of Year 8 students are offered the choice for Year 9 of studying Latin or continuing study of classical civilization.


