## 2020 saw issues of racism come to the fore with Black Lives Matter protests in the USA and the UK...








Alongside protesting police brutality and institutional racism, many called for a more diverse and inclusive curriculum...

In order to become a compassionate and critical citizen, a diverse History curriculum is needed.


#### What we have done...

 Mansa Musa was an African king from the 1300s who is the richest person ever!






#### What we have done...

#### But there is more to do...


We are always looking for ways to introduce Black History into our curriculum and will continue to do so.
