As from 1st September 2021, fines on overdue books will be re-introduced including the usual 3-week loan period for our books.

All Camden Libraries are now open Monday – Thursday 11am – 6pm and Friday and Saturday 11am – 3.30pm with exception of Highgate library and Camden Town Library, please see our [library opening times](#). Come along and choose some new titles, you can spend up to 20 minutes browsing in the library or just return those library books that have overstayed their welcome in your home.

So why wait, get those books back to us now and they can bring enjoyment to someone new.



Compostable caddy liners can be collected free from our libraries. You can collect liners for neighbours and relatives that live in Camden.


To ensure there is enough for everyone we ask you only take one roll.
